To receive the Relay for Life branding and funding, we need to raise at least \$80k - this isn't possible if we do not have the committee members.

- Shiori queries how much \$\$ Relay for Life actually provides Renee is unsure of the exact number, and this will need to be investigated.
- Renee says another concern we have is that none of the committee are returning – Shiori refutes that this was the case in 2020 and it was successful
- Shiori questions the legitimacy of the 'threat' to cancel Relay and Renee states they have cancelled 3 relay groups in the past 18 months
- This needs to be decided by 12pm on Monday and until this moment please kep this away from non-guild involving students.
- We need to go over applicants and see if some have been passed on, but it should be noted that Yasmin has offered positions to people who have not gotten back
- Luke and Georgia want to know if it is currently possible for Relay to go ahead after the interviews today Renee says it is possible and answers Luke's question regarding whether we can add on people later yes, we can. We just need enough momentum to begin. Luke suggests the facsocs have people as 'welfare' members who might be good Renee says there just isn't enough time to get anyone in before Monday maybe they can add on later we need to wait and see but we shouldn't just fill the committee for the sake of it as this will make Yasmin's job harder
