 - Completion of the tavern exterior.
 - Repainting and re-carpeting of the tavern.
 - Renovation and refurbishment of Guild Village and the courtyard near Ref.
 - Completion of the cut-through from Guild Village to the Ref.

Parking

- Working with Head of campus management about whether any communications can be made regarding supply of parking
- Meeting scheduled with Deputy Vice Chancellor Operations to investigate this

Tav 50th Anniversary

IN PROGRESS

This year marks the tavern's 50th anniversary, coinciding with its partial renovations. A focus for the Guild is celebrating its rich history through a year-long celebration.

Introducing specials like student-priced raspberry vodka slushies and historical food and meal specials.

- IN PROGRESS – had tacos and margarita for opening, looking at other products Exploring tavern merchandise, such as steins.

- IN PROGRESS – beer towers on route Organising alumni events.

DONE

Golden Ticket Almost DONE

This initiative provides every first-year student with one free club membership to encourage campus engagement.

- Funding has been secured through the Guild Council Budget.
- Roll out started on o-day with 1109 tickets collected in one day
- great engagement according to the GSC
- tickets will be valid until September so student who weren't able to redeem at oday will have the opportunity to do it at club carnivals or oday 2

Bookshop Guild x Humanities

ONGOING

A very cute initiative that has a lovely range of second handbooks which I keep buying and use to decorate my office.

- I have sorted out merchandise through bookmarks
- Got their social media running
- Updated the guild website to include them
- Currently working with volunteering to get a coordinator to manage this
- Assisting with the recruitment of volunteers

Mirrors in music building

Working with Katrina and Campus management to gauge the feasibility of putting this in the music school. Further consultation with the school is required before action is taken.

Essential Products Pack Almost DONE

To address the cost-of-living crisis, the Guild has funded 1,000 essential product packs to distribute for free.

- Each pack includes toothpaste, a toothbrush, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and moisturiser.
- Special thanks to the guild councillors who were able to come down and assemble packs
- 850 packs were assembled
- Majority of the packs will be given out through the food pantry
- We have distributed some packs to living room so student who are struggling can access it
- We have also distributed packs to security so if they find any students living on campus they are able to distribute some.

Second O-Day in Semester 2

IN PLANNING

The Guild plans to host a second O-day to give campus culture a mid-year boost.

- Instead of a club carnival in Semester 2, Week 3 (though smaller club carnivals will still occur), this will emulate the energy of O-day 1.
- It will feature commercial sponsors similar to the first O-day but on a smaller scale.
- Currently working on securing commercial sponsorships for both O-day 1 and O-day 2.

Ban on announcements in lecture theatres

IN PROGRESS

This ban prevents students from making announcements in lecture theatres due to a number of complaints made to the university. This is an incredibly disappointing policy that not only impacts campus culture and students' ability to promote student activity but also impedes on freedom of speech and expression. This ban was initially meant to take place from o-day but after some push back the announcement is set to release this week and be effective immediately until a solution is found.

The guild executive has taken steps:

- Met with the working group
- Made an formal complaint to the university executive
- Is currently working with the university executive to find a solution as this is not something the guild can endorse.

Currently working on other ways to get announcements to students such as

- displaying the guilds weekly what's on displayed in lectures,
- reposting weekly whats on, on uwa social media
- putting club events in uwa 360

This issue has extended and we are looking at combatting this with an 'protest' club carnival

UniHall fees investigation

- reached out to the head of unihall to schedule a meeting
- currently a busy period so it will be in the next few weeks

Guild Connect

IN PLANNING

This project aims to create a forum for students to connect with professional mentors, research supervisors, and tutors.

- Discussions with Chloe Bull, Director of Venture, are ongoing to centralise existing programs.
- Chloe has been providing fortnightly updates on progress.
- Caught up with Lisa Goldacre who said the university is working on a similar, have set up a meeting with Tennille to include the Guild's perspective

UWA Gaming Hub

IN PROGRESS

Red Bull has approached the Guild to install a gaming centre for e-sports at no cost to the Guild, requiring only a space.

- Paperwork is with the university

Student Initiative Submission Portal

IN PLANNING

This initiative allows students to propose projects for the Guild to action, reducing barriers between students and the Guild.

- Initial discussions with Chloe Bull have been productive.
- A pilot using Microsoft Forms will launch in next few weeks
- If engagement is sufficient, a dedicated portal may be developed in the future.

NUS Engagement

ONGOING

With the recent NUS Conference, engagement has been high.

- Had first state branch meeting
- Had a good discussion with the NUS President and NUS Gensec.
- Keen to see what they do as they both seem quite passionate

Guild Unit Review System

IN PLANNING

This project, in collaboration with Jay, aims to create a more comprehensive system for student feedback on units, improving upon the Best Unit Guide.

- Discussions with Chloe and Venture focus on ensuring feedback is constructive and respectful.
- Questions are being designed to achieve this goal.

UWA Ferry

IN PROGRESS

After years of advocacy from the Guild the state government has committed to installing a ferry at UWA.

- Concerns with the being impacted by the result of the state election
- While this may alleviate parking pressure, stakeholder consultations have been limited.
- The Guild and university have urged further consultation to ensure the location does not disrupt recreational or club activities at Matilda Bay.
- This is to ensure the safety of the community that issues this area

National Student Ombudsman

The National Student Ombudsman will launch in early February as a peak body for student disputes unresolved by universities.

- Spoke with them at Guild O-day

Guild Pilates DONE

The Pilates studio, a collaboration with UWA Sport, has launched

Reid Library

DONE

The library is now open, providing a fantastic space for students.

- Seating capacity has increased by over 140 seats.
- Reid will be open 24/7 by Semester 1.
- The Guild will collaborate with the Library and Student Life to provide helpful services.

New EVA Policy

Caught up with Tash who is the head of this project. Was very insightful and provided a lot of clarity on the EVA policy

- Set up meeting for access with Tash to discuss their concerns as well
- preventing immediate deductions. On the third day, a 15% deduction applies.
- Allows students to miss 20% of assessments that are an accumulative 10%
- Working on how to making the policy more readable and student friendly
- Set up meeting with ethno and Tash to discuss EVA for Ramadan

Tav Wednesdays

Our low-barrier social event will return for 2025, managed by UDUB Radio.

- Planned for the first 3-4 weeks of each semester to capture the peak period activity of the semester, with continuation based on demand.

- Organised a very last minute tav Wednesday with the assistance of Aidan and RSD.
- Was marketed only to colleges and was a free tav show for students to attend.
- Had an attendance of 500 people
- Was a very successful night
- Honky Tonk was very successful as the last tav Wednesday

Non-alcoholic tickets

IN PLANNING

With Ethno investigated whether there is a way for the guild to have alcoholic tickets and non-alcoholic tickets.

- Guild events is investigating this for guild ball as most guild events are either free or don't include alcohol in the ticket

Guild Op-Shop

IN PROGRESS

This initiative promotes sustainable and affordable clothing for students.

Good Sammy's will host an O-day pop-up to gauge interest.

- DONE – very successful, raising almost \$3k
- Multiple pop-ups are planned throughout the year to build momentum.

Volunteering is considering appointing an Op-Shop Coordinator to assist with operations.

Improve SafeZone App

IN PROGRESS

The SafeZone app is essential for campus safety but needs a more user-friendly interface to increase student adoption.

- Discussions with Chloe Bull about app improvements are underway.
- Awaiting data from Safer Communities on app usage.
- Ruby and I will explore potential updates with SafeZone representatives.

Lighting Review IN

PROGRESS

- Ruby and I will be working with security to do a lighting review to find dark spots on campus
- We will also be releasing a survey to students about safety on campus

Free Pregnancy Tests for Students

DONE

The Guild will provide free pregnancy tests to students, addressing the cost-of-living crisis.

Pharmacy is now administering

24/7 Mental Health Support

IN PROGRESS

Working with the university to implement TalkCampus.

- Awaiting updates and coordinating with Jeffrey and the university wellbeing team.
- Received updates that this a peer support system that is made 24hrs has there are people from around the world using it
- Awaiting student life to provide a comprehensive review of this system which Jeffery and I will then show to council

Free Library Dinners During Exams

IN PROGRESS

This initiative will provide free dinners to students in libraries during exam periods.

- Likely options include ramen or other instant hot food.
- Discussions include additional snacks during exams.
- Funding has been secured through the Presidential Budget, with potential support from the university.

WASAC and MASA

IN PROGRESS

Reached out to the School of Indigenous Studies regarding WASAC.

- Spoke to Dr Richard Wally from the school of indigenous studies and are reaching out to have a meeting with him regarding a WASAC rep
- Investigating contacts for MASA.

Albany

IN PROGRESS

Reached out to head of Albany

- Discussed the students getting involved in prosh
- Discussed providing incentives for club excursions to Albany campus and do events
- I will be visiting Albany early in the semester to talk to students about the guild and how we help

Free nappies in the parents rooms

We have supplied free nappies to the libraries to support mature aged students with children

- PSA budget used
- We will be tracking usage according

Food for Fines

Following an NUS state branch meeting I have been investigating implementing food for fine. This will result in a month or a couple of months where instead of paying for a fine students can donate around \$20 worth of non-perishable food to the food panty

I have been in discussion with:

- Trever Humphries – head of campus management
- Selina Torress – DVCO
- Jude and Ollie who later approached to also work on this project
- Craig MacKenzie – head of parking

There has been interest. I have been advised to take this to the transport advisory group and Craig will also talk to his connections in Curtin about how it is administered

Guild outlets providing specific foods that co-inside with faith/cultural holidays

- Working with commercial team through catering and tavern to have specific foods for different holidays
- Working with PAC and will also reach out to ethno to discuss different holidays to ensure we can cater to as many needs as possible

Garlic bread in the tav

- Secured garlic bread in the tav as a less oily option for sides!

Vending machines in Music school

- Working with the commercial team and the music school to see where the optimal place to have a vending machine in the northern end of the uni

Mental health pop up

- Was going to be more specifically for womens mental health and that will definitely be a focus
- Was raised in safer communities and will be a collaboration with the living room and wellbeing team

- However it was also raised that maybe we should also target other groups with different themes
- Therefore this collaboration has evolved and will now be themed pop ups around the uni such as a men's mental health pop up etc

Cost of living sustainability project

- Working with the university on what projects we can fund to assist with the cost of living.
- Guild has secured \$100k from the university to put into this initiative

Food for fines

- Worked with Jude and Nikhi, waiting to hear back from Nikhi when she goes to bring it to a committee. This project aims to help with cost of living and to encourage donations of essential food items instead of parking fines.

Music Vending Machine

- Consultation with Music department ongoing as to the location of where it is to be installed. Several places rejected due to their use in performances and wanting to keep them looking clean and uncluttered.

Pub Crawl Club Package

- Working with Ethan, Emilia, and Catering to bring out a competitive package to encourage clubs to start using tav for pub crawls instead of Varsity or other places. Still in the planning stage with Gus as to the commercial feasibility of it, as Tav Lager is already heavily discounted for Guild members all week round.

Marketing

- Working with Nikhi for better recognition/understanding of what Guild can help students with, Guild for Dummies coming soon. The idea is to help guide students to the right place should they have questions regarding different aspects of Guild.

Essential hygiene product packs

- Worked with Nikhi to sticker and distribute hygiene packs to the living room and UWA security. This will allow both places to better distribute these packs to students in need, should students be in difficult positions living on campus or anything else.

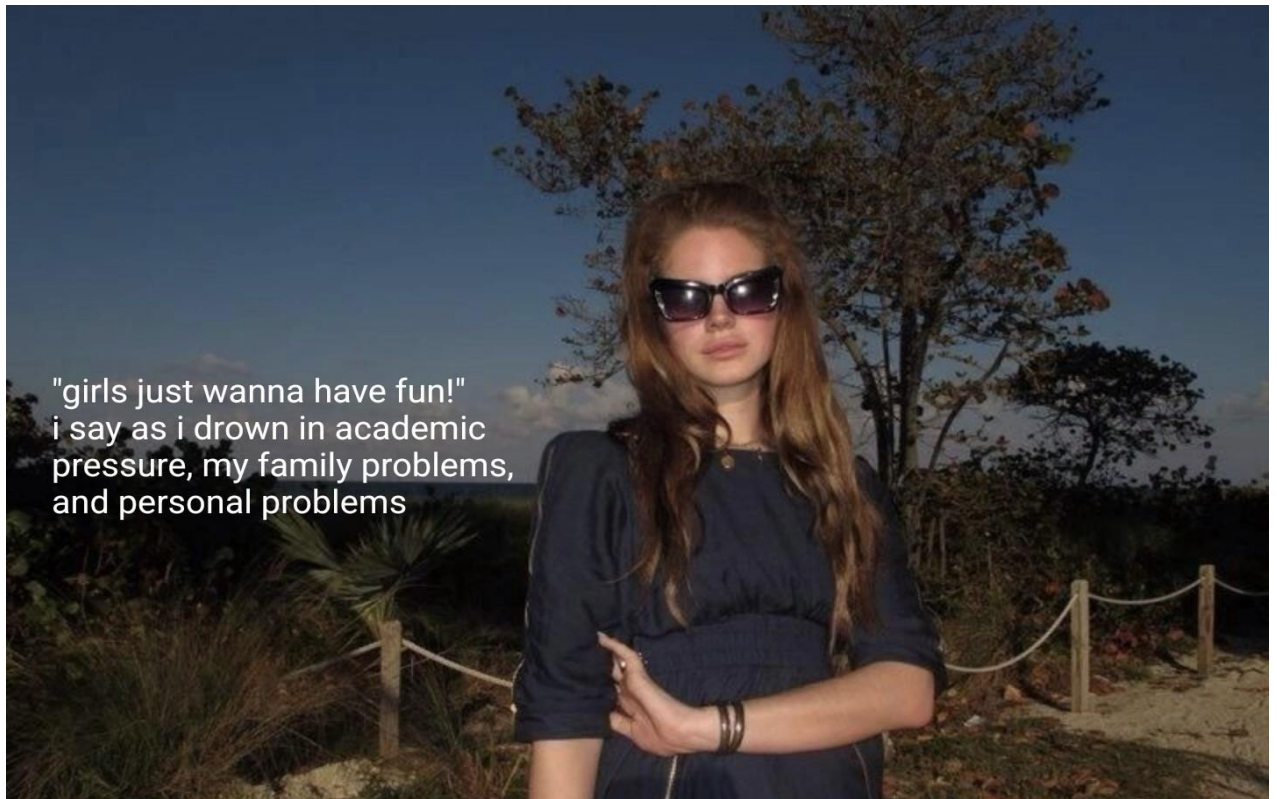

Ed Council

University Learning and Teaching Committee

The University have agreed to restart the Centre for Learning and Teaching which will hopefully have some positive developments in supporting staff and students in the future and advancing learning and teaching outcomes here at UWA. We were also given updates and set standards for the goals and priorities of the committee for the year.

Some core members of the committee are currently doing a Assessment Policy Review which we are hopeful to advocate some of our key policy changes to be implemented alongside the review. The first committee meeting for the year set high expectations and I look forward to continuing to update Council on the actions of the ULTC in the coming months.

Student Digital Experience Working Group

Attended this committee for the first time on behalf of Nikhi. Wasn't quite sure what to expect and it was a much more intimate committee experience than usual but had some productive conversations around the roadmap to IT upgrades required at UWA and some of the key focuses and metrics the University needed to be focusing on like standardised LMS settings and resolving on invalid units for students.

Academic Board

Attended my first Academic Board for the year. Was updated and introduced to a lot of the academics I'll be working alongside this year. Was glad to see the University, at the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor, not adopt the Group of 8's problematic definition of anti-semitism. Advocated against the University adopting stricter, retroactive contact cheating punishments.

Academic Integrity Advisory Group

Attended my first academic integrity advisory group meeting for the year. First started by reviewing and closing off any outstanding action items from last year. Received a report from the chair which included updates of Centralisation Trial and AI usage in the University, including AI detection technology. Then discussed transition group to a more formal entity in the university's governance structure but ultimately decided not to do so as the University is trying to limit the amount of committee's that report to Academic Board and UEC.

Thanks to Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club and Softball WA, we were able to provide charities and clubs with marquees, trestle tables and chairs to borrow.

Huge thanks to the Event Managers at UWA Student Guild, Leigh and Alice for making my idea come to life. For anyone wanting to host a similar event, I will be writing a debrief with tips. Please let me know if you are interested in reading this.

Pop-Up Op Shop

Guild Volunteering and Enviro hosted a Pop-Up Op Shop. Many fantastic volunteers from the Op Shop committee helped run the event. We raised over \$1,000 for The Good Sammy's, provided affordable clothing options for students and saved hundreds of clothing items from going to landfill.

Massive thanks to Venture's Perla Valdez and Henriette Maitland for helping massively in the event planning process, and Jasmin Bentink from UWA SNAGS for being MC. It was amazing seeing many students from a wide range of disciplines come together thanks to a passion for sustainability.

Sustainable Transport Skate and Brekkie

We collaborated with UWA Rollerblading Club to host a morning skate and breakfast at Matilda Bay, to celebrate using alternative, emission-free modes of transport. UWA Rollerblading Club had their biggest attendance at a morning skate, ever. It was great seeing so many students give rollerblading a crack!

Nature Photography Walk

UWA Students of Natural and Agricultural Sciences Club, Zoology Club, Photography Club, Students of Environmental Engineering Club and Co-Exist Perth joined us for a nature walk around Kings Park, followed by a picnic. We had a massive turnout, with around 60 students attending. It was a great opportunity for students to meet new people and make friends whilst appreciating the environment. A photography competition was held for the best photo taken via our social media channels.

Other Events:

Clean Up Australia Day Beach Clean Up:

In a collaboration with Science Union, Enviro ran our first event, a beach clean-up at Cottesloe Beach. We had a representative from Keep WA Beautiful Council talk to students about plastic pollution. We had 15 students show up and we picked up around 10 kg of rubbish.

Campus Clean Up:

Enviro and Public Affairs Council hosted a 'Campus Clean-up' to celebrate Social Impact Week. It was shocking to find so much plastic pollution and rubbish on UWA's grounds. It is a stark reminder that we need to work with the university to ensure this rubbish is cleaned up and educate students about the correct way to dispose rubbish, and the negative implications of littering. The six of us picked up around 30 kg of rubbish in an hour!

Upcoming Events:

Rottnest Island Beach Clean Up:

The Rottnest Foundation is keen to collaborate with Enviro for a beach clean-up on Rottnest Island. Students would need to pay for a Rottnest Foundation membership to participate, which costs \$25. This will include a return ferry ticket, the landing fee and lunch. The membership also includes three member days each year, where they can come over for a full day of conserving the island. After the beach clean up, students can spend the rest of the day exploring the island. This will be a very exciting event!

Australian Youth Climate Coalition:

The Australian Youth Climate Coalition will be collaborating with Enviro to host an event centred around the upcoming federal election. The event will focus around:

- Enrolling young people (currently 1 in 10 aren't enrolled)
- Inspire people to actively engage in our democracy and share issues that matter to them
- Learn more about how our voting system works (e.g. preferential voting)

During this event, we hope to have local members running in the federal elections talk in a panel discussion. The event is not centred around favouring a particular party, and we will be staying neutral. We hope to inform students to think and research before they vote.

Pop-Up Op Shop and Workshop:

We will be hosting another Pop-Up Op Shop on Wednesday 9th April in collaboration with Guild Volunteering. Loraine Martin, The Feel Good Fashionista will be hosting a workshop on how your wardrobe choices shape a more just and sustainable world. This event is supported by UWA Grand Challenges and the Waste Sorted Community Education Grant.

Climate for Change – Climate Conversations Workshop:

Climate for Change is a not-for-profit that focus on fostering conversations about climate change to inspire action. We will be collaborating to host a workshop around having meaningful conversations and how students can have a positive impact on the environment.

Guild Departments Paint and Sip:

In collaboration with Access, Pride, Wellbeing and Women’s Department, we will running a paint and sip activity. Come down and enjoy a lunch and drinks, whilst expressing your artistic ability.

Projects:

UWA’s Carbon Neutral Events Dashboard:

UWA Campus Management is working towards making the university a greener campus, through their new Carbon Neutral Events dashboard. Clubs can fill out a simple form, stating how much they spent on food, drinks, venue hire, promotion and transport, and the university will offset the carbon emissions through investing in carbon offsets (planting trees to sequester carbon). At the next SOCPAC meeting, Enviro will speak alongside Campus Management, to promote this initiative to clubs.

This is something the Environment Department is going to be involved in, as students will be able to send any questions or queries they have about the process to the Environment Department. We will also be heavily promoting this initiative on our social media channels and website, and also plan to speak at the April Education Council meeting.

Sustainable Clubs Award at Guild Ball:

As a way to promote sustainability amongst UWA clubs and faculty societies, the Environment Department hope to give an award to the most sustainable club at Guild Ball. This award will be a fantastic incentive for students to apply for carbon offsets, reduce their waste at events, and host nature-based events with a positive environmental awareness such as beach clean ups or tree planting. We are working with the SOC committee to make this award possible.

Clubs borrowing Beach Clean Up Equipment:

Thanks to Keep WA Beautiful Council and Clean Up Australia, we have two clean up kits which can cater to over 40 students. We hope we can either lend the equipment to Guild Student Central, to book similar to how you would for marquees, tables, etc. Otherwise, we can organise for clubs to meet us to pick up the equipment. We have also created a ‘How To Guide’ on how to run a beach clean-up, which covers everything from marketing to safety. The equipment pack will also contain a first aid kit for organisers to use if needed.

ONGOING

Participated in the roundtable discussion regarding student announcements restrictions around teaching activities, and the tightening of poster, banner, stall, and flyer regulations including the implication on clubs and student activism. Temporary Food Vendor Permits

COMPLETED

From January 1, the Food Service Notifications system is no longer used by the City of Perth, preventing student clubs from receiving food permits at no cost. The new system has an annual cost of \$48 for temporary food stalls, which would include bake sales and barbeques. This is a barrier to small to medium clubs. With Ethan, investigating if the Guild may see a need to purchase a Temporary Food Vendor Permit at \$48 for the year, allowing Guild affiliated clubs to hold their stalls without this additional cost. It was determined by liaison with Guild Events that this was not necessary.

Expanding the Peer Assisted Learning Program

COMPLETED

Liaised with the Academic Skills Centre (ASC, aka StudySmarter) to discuss how units are selected for the Peer Assisted Learning (PAL) program. Units are selected from those in first year with the highest enrolment, and generally from a mixed range of faculties. Mixed engagement levels. When queried about the expansion of the project, ASC recommended smaller groups and sent through material on how to effectively organise a study group.

The Gaza ceasefire has been broken. It has been reported that the current wave of attacks on the people of Gaza has been the most intense yet, with over 400 people (138 children) killed in the first day of Israel's continuation of the bombing. Al Jazeera reports that food, water and electricity continue to be blocked for the third consecutive week.

Mahmoud Khalil, a leader figure of the Colombia Student Encampment, has been effectively kidnapped by the Trump Administration.

Food for fines:

Having been inspired by similar initiatives at Curtin University and various local city council libraries, I am really keen to bring the initiative to UWA and increase donations to the Guild's food pantry. Food for Fines is a program where for a certain time period, there's an option to pay off a fine by donating non-perishable food items of a certain minimum value to a food bank. [Here's](#) Curtin's one as an example.

I reached out to Oliver to help me action this, and we have both since met with Nikhi to discuss this in more detail. Very exciting stuff!

Ensuring UWA cuts its ties with Israeli institutions

I finally have received conformation from Fiona at Student Life that UWA has decided to **suspend its exchange program with the Hebrew University of Jerusalem (HUJ)**!

This is wonderful news that is coming after over **a year and half of advocacy** I have been doing on this matter. This advocacy originally started when I was vice-president of the Palestinian Cultural Society of UWA in 2023. I had numerous meetings with Student life and wrote a detailed, referenced report cataloguing the human rights issues and safety issues posed by an exchange program with HUJ, including HUJ's facilitation of state violence against its Palestinian students, it's presence on internationally recognised occupied

Palestinian territory and its suppression of academic freedom and freedom of speech. I had also met with the 2024 Guild president and ethnocultural department in hopes of having the Guild officially endorse the suspension of the HUJ exchange program.

In light of the blatantly anti-Palestinian measures being taken by UWA to suppress freedom of speech, this is one bit of good news.

Improving library facilities for health campus students:

I had a chat with Caroline Clark, UWA's library manager and raised the matter of having more microwaves installed, bringing back some of the library's computers (as they all had been replaced by monitors over the break) as well as ensuring that all broken power points were repaired. She is currently to follow up with her team to see in what way these things can be addressed.

In March's Catering and Tavern committee meeting, I discussed with the committee if we could look into selling more portable and affordable food options at the Dental kiosk and/or placing a new food vending machine so that health students had more convenient food options.

Full BDS Compliance at the Guild:

I am researching some replacement companies that are BDS compliant.

Mirror Mirror on the Wall

Upon further investigation, I discovered that Campus Management has previously informed the UWA Conservatorium of Music that IKEA freestanding mirrors are not compliant with requirements for public spaces and do not meet the necessary glass requirements. Additionally, I was able to find a copy of the previous quote the Con received in 2023 for five mirrors with commercial grade glass, safety back and polish edges to be clipped to the wall. I have forwarded this information onto John Walter via email on the 7th of March and am waiting for a reply to determine when an updated assessment of any safety risks and controls can be completed to start the next phase of the plan!
